Core Principles of Feedback & Marking

"Our children will know more, can remember more and apply more"

Context

Feedback and marking is a two way process that celebrates a child's achievements in order to promote their self-esteem and confidence. It acknowledges and advances children's progress, motivating them to do their best, taking ownership and responsibility within their learning.

Core Principles

- 1. Child Centred / Meaningful Using either oral or written methods, children can understand their feedback and know how to act upon it. Thereby ensuring children are involved fully in the feedback process.
- 2. **Motivating** acknowledges achievement, celebrates progress whilst offering support and challenge.
- 3. Manageable variety of feedback techniques are employed that are appropriate to age, stage and task given.
- 4. Ownership children take ownership and responsibility for learning and are fully involved in feedback.
- **5. Consistent** all work is dated and acknowledged by adults, and agreed principles applied throughout the school.
